
# What are resource policies?

### What is the Policy Development Process?

----The set of steps by which the African Internet community proposes, deliberates and adopts the policies that guide the use of number resources in the AFRINIC service region----


#### Initial submission


Author submits a new policy or a modification to existing one at rpd@afrinic.net or policy-submission@afrinic.net

If required, the PDWG co-chairs work with the author to format the proposal as appropriate




